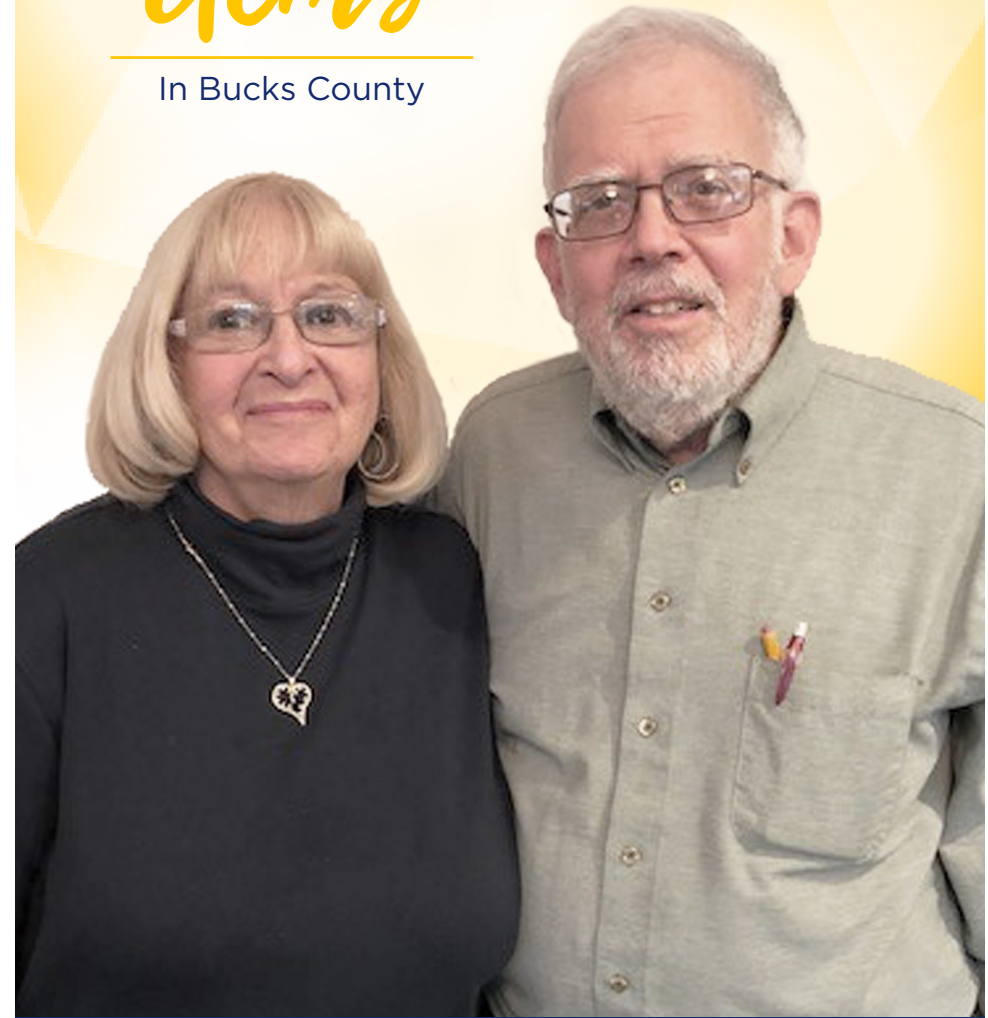

Face to Face - Portraits in America | Monday, April 29

Famous people and the not so well known – the stories behind the portraits, including fashions of the times and hints the artist gives us as to the life of the sitter. Paintings include images by John Singleton Copley, John Singer Sergeant, Andy Warhol and Alice Neil with her surprising self –portrait as well as images by other artists.

The Age of Impressionism | Monday, May 6

The Impressionist art movement originated in France in the 1860's. Artists were concerned with depicting a feeling from a visual impression – especially through shifting effects of light and color. This style of painting is popular even today. Included in the presentation are works by artists Manet, Monet, Renoir, Cassatt, Morisot, and Degas.

The Art of American Illustration – An Exploration | Monday, May 13

What is the difference between art and illustration? Attend this class to learn the distinction between each of them. Featured Artists will include Norman Rockwell, N.C. Wyeth and Maxfield Parrish.

Gustave Eiffel and His Tower | Monday, May 20

The World's Fair in Paris 1889 exhibited the latest in medicine, science and engineering as well as art exhibits and settings featuring other cultures from around the world. A "Wild West" show provided daily entertainment featuring Wild Bill Cody and Annie Oakley. But the Eiffel Tower with its huge proportions and height became the "Star" of the fair.

Because documentaries are non-fiction, audiences usually assume that they are objective but the form is as subjective as any other kind of storytelling. This series will explore the ways that filmmakers put a spin on their story from the moment they decide how to frame a subject in production to what they choose to either include in or cut out of the finished product.
