

**The following items can be brought in starting immediately and put into one of the collection bins. Please put your contributions in a bag labeled “Mitzvah Day”**

- For A Woman’s Place (shelter for abused women)  
Skin and hair care products, deodorant, cosmetics, cosmetic bags, tissues, dental products, razors, hand sanitizer, diapers size 4 or 5, baby wipes, feminine hygiene products. Any size is fine, including samples and hotel bottles. Please solicit your dentist, hair stylist, nail salon, dermatologist, etc for donations. These will be assembled into personal care bags for women staying at the shelter
- Coloring books and crayons (no dollar store crayons, as they may be toxic), kids stickers
- Canned/package food with expiration date after May 1

**Please start to save the following items at home, to be collected in April (no storage room) for Impact Thrift Stores**

- Clothing in good condition (adult and children), shoes, accessories, jewelry, small appliances, domestics (sheets, towels, blankets), housewares, bric-a-brac-, books, CDs, sporting goods, strollers
- Electronics must be in perfect working order and computers must be no more than 5 years old.

All clothing, shoes, purses, belts, bed/bath/table linens and electronics will be accepted for either sale in our stores or responsibly recycled.

**Unacceptable Donations (please pay attention – to dispose of unusable donations cost lots of money)**

- Cribs and carseats
- Combustible items: kerosene, gasoline, propane, oil-based paints, lamp or motor oil, any hazardous materials/liquids
- Console stereos (unless in perfect, like-new condition)
- Non-cable-ready TVs or TVs with turn dial knobs
- Opened containers/packages
- Opened games or puzzles
- Skis, poles, and boots
- Encyclopedias
- Toys, stuffed animals
